Northwest Hair Academy was a mid-size vocational school with four campuses serving western and mid Washington state. During my time working there the students numbered around 100-300 and the programs offered included Instructor Training, Cosmetology, and Manicuring.

- Developing a new curriculum: this included writing and designing a 200-page workbook, teacher answer key, as well as writing all lesson plans to ensure that the curriculum meets all Washington state licensing requirements as will as NACCAS accreditation requirements.
- Training instructors: this included multiple trainings over the course of a year to ensure that all instructional staff was familiar enough with the new curriculum to teach it correctly
- Creating schedules for classes: to ensure that all lesson plans were covered within the 1600 clock hour program as well as appropriate written and practical student evaluations.
- Graphic design work: this included the NWHA workbook, flyers for promotions, visual aids for the classrooms and price lists for the front desk to ensure that all promotional and instructional paperwork was consistent and professional quality.
